





The Nainital Parliamentary seat has witnessed a vibrant political history. The journey of its winners reflects the political currents of the region and the nation. Over a span of 27 years, from 1951 to 1998, among the winning candidates were the family members of Bharat Ratna Pandit Govind Ballabh Pant, After Independence, in the first Lok Sabha election of 1951-52, the political secretary of Pandit Pant, won from the Nainital Parliamentary seat with a margin of 19486 votes. In

the elections of 1957, again the political secretary won by a margin of 29487 votes.

Pandit Pant's son, K.C. Pant, served as a Member of Parliament from Nainital Parliamentary seat continuously for 15 years from 1962 to 1977. K.C. Pant held several ministerial portfolios in the Central Cabinet for over 25 years, including Defence, Finance, Home Affairs, Education, Steel and Heavy Engineering, Electronics, Atomic Energy, Space, Irrigation & Power, Energy, Coal.

K.C. Pant also served as the Chairman of the Energy Commission, Chairman of the 10th Finance Commission, Vice Chairman of the Planning Commission, Prime Minister's Interlocutor for Kashmir, Chairman of Prime Minister's Task Force on Infrastructure, Member of Cabinet Committee on Security(CCS), Chairman of the Population Commission, Chairman of RIS, and Co-Chairman of the Indo-UK Round Table Talks.

In the elections of 1962-1967, K.C. Pant won from the Nainital Parliamentary seat by a margin of 64643 votes, in 1967-1971 by a margin of 33859 votes, and in 1971-1977 by nearly 1 lakh votes.

K.C. Pant also served as a Rajya Sabha Member from Uttar Pradesh from 1978 to 1984. He was Leader of the House, Rajya Sabha from 1979 to 1980.

In the elections of 1984-1989, K.C. Pant won from New Delhi Parliamentary seat by a margin of 72886 votes.

In 1998, Ila Pant, the daughter-in-law of Bharat Ratna Pandit Govind Ballabh Pant, won from Nainital seat. Ila Pant remains the only female candidate to have reached Parliament from the Nainital Parliamentary seat since Independence.

Based on the legacy of the family and their intensive dedication to public life, it is clear that this family has made significant contribution to Indian Politics and development. Pandit Govind Ballabh Pant, who was a crucial figure in the independence struggle and considered a visionary leader, laid the foundation of modern governance and was responsible for all round development in Uttar Pradesh, India's largest and most populous State as the Prime Minister of United Provinces from 1937-1939 and the First Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh from 1946-1954 and later across India as Union Home Minister from 1954-61.



His son, K.C. Pant, while heading several Ministries for over 25 years made significant impact in Defense, Education, Steel, Power, Energy, Atomic Energy, Irrigation, Planning, Finance, Allocation of Finances to States, Security related matters, he was instrumental in formulating the Policy to form India's National Security Council and the appointment of the First NSA.








